

Happy Second Sunday of Easter! Today is also known PASTORAL SHARINGS as Divine Mercy Sunday, and we will be offering the Anointing Sacrament of the Sick at the 10:15 Mass. May God's Divine Mercy heal the hurting and comfort the infirm, as we celebrate the Season of Renewal!

Things are being renewed at the Catholic Center downtown. The two highest positions that a priest can hold in the diocese are Vicar General and Chancellor. Both are suddenly vacant, and I am happy to announce that I have not been assigned to either one! But my classmate, Fr. Mark Noonan has.

Msgr. Slubecky has retired and Fr. Mark is the new Vicar General. It's a bold move from our bishop to appoint a young priest in this position, but a wise one. Fr. Mark has that dynamic orthodoxy which marks the new generation of priests. He's faithful to the Church but in a fresh way. This will be good for our diocese.

The other position, Chancellor, has traditionally been a priest but doesn't have to be. Many dioceses are hiring women for this highranking role. Bishop Malone has done so, appointing Sr. Regina Murphy SSMN as Interim Chancellor. Sr. Regina will lead the diocese through a project which came from the Presbyteral Council (formerly called the Priest Senate). Here, in her words, is a description:

"Bishop Malone and his Presbyteral Council are looking into ways to promote both the spiritual welfare of priests and the liturgical life of each parish. They are particularly concerned about the number and quality of Masses celebrated at each parish. With a declining number of priests, we should not expect priests to celebrate more liturgies on a weekend than are needed; and, fewer Masses with larger attendance would encourage more vibrant celebrations of the Eucharist.

The Bishop is asking all parishes to engage in a collaborative effort to look at Mass schedules and Mass attendance. This will be coordinated at the Vicariate level with suggestions to be sent to a Diocesan Task Force that has been established by the Bishop. Engagement in this process at the parish level will be vital in creating a revised and coordinated Vicariate Mass schedule that will promote the physical and spiritual well-being of priests as well as provide quality liturgical celebrations in each parish."

What does this mean for us in the pews? Mainly, data needs to be collected. We will be taking a fresh look at the seating capacity of our building, and making official attendance counts for the rest of April.

Perhaps you just started coming back to church at Easter. Please keep coming! We are energized by your presence at worship. I've been spending a lot of time in church, gazing at the altar and smelling the flowers. Our altar sanctuary reminds us that spring is coming. Please also take a look at the flyer for our April pilgrimage with St. Maximillian Kolbe parish, which is happening April 28th. By then, spring will be here in full vibrancy! Praise to the Risen King!
