Of all the things Jesus says which seem totally bat-crazy, this one might take the cake: "But I say to

you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you. An enemy is someone who desires the destruction of you, your projects, or those you care about. To love and pray for them is to want their health, strength, and flourishing. But if they thrive, they are more likely to hurt you and others. So, aren't you indirectly willing your own destruction, or that of your friends? If you doubt that this problem is embedded in this teaching, when was the last time you actually prayed honestly for the people you really bate? How can we solve this riddle so for the people you really hate? How can we solve this riddle so we might actually live this command? Recall that enemy-love is the surest sign that you love someone with God's love, and not with indirect egotism. After all, if my love for my enemy ends up hurting me or my loved ones, it can't be for me. Enemy-love costs more because there are no tit-for-tats. No reciprocity just loved poured out, and often pain in return. That's why it is so precious and rare. "What is unusual about that?" asks the Lord about love for our friends. Jesus wants us to experience the unusual love which only comes from him. When Jesus was being killed on the cross, he was loving his executioners. In fact, he was holding them in being as they nailed him to the cross. He loved those who were spiritually piercing his Mother's heart, while they were doing it. And when he rose from the dead, he showed us that this kind of love is always worth it. It's stronger than death. Real love is unusual.

LENTEN SCHEDULE

ASH WEDNESDAY - February 22 - Mass with distribution of Ashes at 4:30 PM Poor Man's Supper - Following Ash Wednesday Mass Stations of the Cross - Every Friday During Lent

Lenten Reminders: Abstinence - All Catholics 14 and older are bound to abstain totally from meat on the following days: Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Fasting - All Catholics between their 18th and 59th birthdays are also bound to observe on the following days: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions in the course of the day. Easter Duty - After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This must be fulfilled during the Easter season, unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time during the year. This obligation may be fulfilled between February 26, 2023 (First Sunday of Lent) and June 4, 2023 (Trinity Sunday).

Lenten Reflection Retreat - Please join in Bishop Robert Barron's "Conversion Following the Call of Christ" Word on Fire Study led by Rose Elliott for 6 weeks starting Wednesday, March 1st, following 5:30 Mass.

Poor Man's Supper - The women's guild invites parishioners to our Lenten Meal after 4:30 mass on Ash Wednesday. A simple meal of homemade soups (gluten free choice available) with bread, and beverage provided.

Collection for Response to Love Center - As we approach Valentine's Day, please donate personal care items for the needy: toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, soaps for personal hygiene, also laundry items, baby diapers.
