

From the desk of the Pastor Dear Parish Family,

Alleluia! He is Risen! Alleluia!

It is with great joy we celebrate Easter. The Pascal Mystery is the central mystery of our faith. The sacrifice of Jesus reconciles us to the God the Father. The Son is both the High Priest, who offers the perfect sacrifice to the Father, and He is the sacrifice offered to reconcile us to the Father.

Jesus on Good Friday is obedience unto death. He redeems the sin of Adam. He frees us to become children of God though baptism.

On the night of Holy Saturday, we celebrate the "Mother of All Vigils"; the Easter Vigil. Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Sundays. We celebrate Christ's victory over Death. This is the good news we proclaim from for all the world to hear: Christ Has Risen, Christ has truly Risen!

But this joyful news is just the beginning. For not only has Christ Risen, but through our baptisms into His death we were also baptized into His Resurrection. Through our baptisms, we share in the Resurrection. This is the true joy of Easter.

The disciples of Jesus have a similar experience when they encounter the Risen Christ. Mary Magdelene and the disciples on the road to Emmaus fail to recognize Jesus. When Jesus reveals himself, their lives are forever changed.

In the movie *Risen*, there is a scene where the Roman centurion is interrogating Bartholomew, one of the Apostles. Bartolomew is asked, 'what does the Resurrection mean?' His response is perfect. "Eternal Life for everyone, everyone who believes." The centurion asks, "how many are you?" Bartholomew responds, "few in number and our only weapon is love but, this changes everything!"

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ changes everything. Like the early followers of Jesus, once you recognize the Risen Christ and have had an experience of Him you will be forever changed.

May this Easter season be your opportunity to recognize Him, experience Him, and receive the future gift of enteral life. At the end of his encounter with the centurion, Bartholomew is asked where the followers of Jesus are. May his response, "they are everywhere" be true today and every day, as we proclaim Jesus Christ has Risen today.

Mary, Mother of God, pray for us. St. Teresa of Avila, pray for us.




Revelation





Harvest House -- Children's Clothing Drive
