

Fourth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parishioners,

We are now moving quickly through the Easter season. Fifty days may seem long, but Pentecost will be here before we know it. During this time our first readings are taken from the Acts of the Apostles. Some biblical scholars refer to the Acts of the Apostles as the gospel of the Holy Spirit.

As we listen to the first reading this weekend it is not hard to realize how true this statement is. The Holy Spirit is front and center in the passages we heard during Easter Season. Peter is filled with the Holy Spirit when he addresses the leaders of the people. One of the gifts of the Holy Spirit is courage. We are in great need of this particular gift today. We are called like Peter to boldly proclaim the gospel with love.

Throughout the history of the Catholic Church, when she has done this, she has grown. Of course, growth is only important if it results in the salvation of souls. Growth is not, or at least should not be, the goal. Salvation of souls is the goal of proclaiming the gospel. That is why both the truth and love are necessary in proclaiming the gospel.

Once again, the Acts of the Apostles gives us the example of how we are going to renew the Church, and by extension, renew the face of the earth. Before the Sanhedrin Peter and John do not yell and scream, they calmly proclaim Christ risen from the dead.

Yes, they accuse the people of putting to death the author of life, but not to condemn them but to urge them to repentance for their sins. Peter has not forgotten the message of the Risen Lord in the upper room on the morning of the Resurrection, "Peace be with you." Peter knows that Jesus has not come to condemn the world but to offer salvation and eternal life to everyone. He knows this not only because Jesus taught him this, but because he experienced it in his life.

We must do the same! Not only must we teach what we have learned but we must share what we have experienced in the Risen Lord. Hopefully we have all experienced the power of God's forgiveness through the Sacrament of Penance. To acknowledge that I am a sinner, in need of a redeemer, is the first step of conversion. Then, to recognize the true nature of God's love is to realize that you are a beloved child of God.

God loves you unconditionally. His desire is for all human beings (and all of creation) to be one with Him. Not on our terms but on His terms. This means that we are called to live in the light of His truth in love. And having received that light, truth, and love, we are sent into the darkness of this world to lead others to the light, the truth, with love.

The Apostles conquered the Roman Empire by boldly proclaiming the truth, living in the light of the truth, and sharing the love of God with everyone. Our challenges are different than theirs, but not more difficult. With the same Holy Spirit, we can conquer the culture of death that is so pervasive in Western culture today.

We must keep in the forefront of our minds and hearts that God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world but that the world might be saved through Him.

Mary, Mother of God, pray for us. St. Teresa of Avila, pray for us.

Dedicate the Sanctuary Candle - The red Sanctuary Lamp is located near the tabernacle, in both the church and chapel, and burns to remind us of the presence of Jesus Christ. 

Did you work in other fields prior to becoming a priest?

I was a Special Education Teacher with deaf/blind children for 2 Years at the NY State School for the Blind in Batavia and worked for 6 years with the US Treasury Office both in Los Angeles, CA and Ithaca, NY

When were you ordained? What parishes were you previously assigned to? I was ordained on July 21, 1990. My first assignment was to Immaculate Conception in East Aurora and then to SS Peter & Paul in Hamburg. I have been a faculty member at Christ the King Seminary, Vocations Director for the Diocese of Buffalo, Pastor of Saint George in West Falls, NY, Pastor of All Saints Church in Lockport, and most recently, Pastor of Our Lady of Peace in Clarence.

Currently, I serve as Bishop's Delegate for Priestly Life and Care; a Priest Council and Chancery Curia member; and am a member of the Priest Personnel, Priest Retirement and Lay Pension boards. I also serve as the Chaplain for the Lockport Fire Department and Lockport Men and Women Ancient Order of Hibernians.

Who encouraged/inspired you to become a priest?

The Priests that I grew up with in my home parish, Sacred Heart in Batavia, inspired me to become a priest.


